## *From the Executive Director and Board President*

Greetings from Friends of Trees! We are pleased to present our 2008 Annual Report. As you read this, please keep in mind the great strides we have made as we enter our 20th anniversary year. Both our Neighborhood Trees and our Natural Area Restoration programs have experienced growth, as have our budget, our staff, and our capacity. We couldn't have grown in scope and accomplishments without our members and volunteers.

During the 2007-08 planting season, Friends of Trees planted a total of 21,984 trees and native plants in the metro region, with 1,985 volunteers giving 18,007 hours of their time. Of the total number of trees planted, 1,852 were street and yard trees planted in 62 neighborhoods, which represented a nearly 30 percent increase in our Neighborhood Trees program. Our Natural Area Restoration program planted 20,132 native trees and plants in 18 natural areas in seven metro cities.

Additionally, both our budget and our partnerships grew. Revenue grew to \$825,484 as we added new sponsorship partners Port of Portland, IKEA, Oregon Soap Company, and East Multnomah Soil & Water Conservation District. This third consecutive year of growth poised Friends of Trees to meet the continuing demand and need for community-based volunteer tree-planting efforts.

Friends of Trees was pleased to host its first awards luncheon to honor supporters who contributed time and resources at a level representing exemplary leadership. Our 2008 leadership award recipients were Portland General Electric for business support, Portland's Bureau of Environmental Services for community partner support, and longtime Friends of Trees advocate, volunteer and contributor Charlie Swindells for individual support.

Organizational growth also occurred at the capacity and staffing levels. In addition to implementing an improved web site and online ordering system, we strengthened our development team by adding a full-time associate director of membership development and a full-time volunteer and outreach coordinator.

As we ended our 2007-08 fiscal year in August, we laid the groundwork for adding a Neighborhood Trees staff member in Gresham, establishing a second Friends of Trees staff member position in a regional metro-area office. The new position was funded by the J. Frank Schmidt Family Foundation and coincided with Gresham's move to become a National Arbor Day Tree City USA. We also continued our Greening the Eastside Campaign by expanding partnerships with Portland General Electric, Metro, Oregon Department of Transportation, and Portland's Bureau of Environmental Services, and by forming a new partnership with the nonprofit Verde.

While we are pleased with our progress, Friends of Trees still has much work to do. The challenging economic landscape of 2009 has meant facing deferred facility and technology needs as well as increased staffing needs.

Friends of Trees is 20 years old in 2009, and we are stronger than ever. Increasing numbers of elected officials and communities recognize the importance and multiple values of urban trees and community forestry, and are turning to Friends of Trees to implement our award-winning programs. Additionally, many citizens are turning to volunteerism to build their communities, and increasing numbers of people have a vested interest in developing their neighborhoods.

## *Neighborhood Trees*

Our Neighborhood Trees program planted 1,852 street, yard and school trees in Portland, Vancouver and Beaverton during fiscal year 2008, including 250 percent more street trees in Vancouver than were planted the previous year. At the end of the planting season, we celebrated Arbor Month by removing concrete and planting 30 commercial-sized trees at six businesses in Portland's Eastside Industrial District, reducing storm water runoff and sewer overflows while beautifying a part of the city that has been predominantly concrete. The program also planted 30 large Douglas-Firs and Western Redcedars in Beaverton for Arbor Day.

The Neighborhood Trees program's biggest accomplishment was improving customer service for homeowners. Our new online order system allowed us to offer a 50 percent greater tree selection and increased our cash flow and efficiency. We eliminated the need for homeowners to select "second choice" species and provided homeowners who planted at the last event of the season the same selection of tree species as homeowners who planted on the first planting date.

Additionally, the program added plantings in the Buckman and Lents neighborhoods as part of Friends of Trees' Greening the Eastside Campaign to increase tree cover in eastside neighborhoods with the fewest trees. The program's fall volunteer recruitment drive was also successful, adding 30 new assistant crew leaders to the team of volunteers who guide homeowners and planting volunteers at our weekend plantings.

"I think this organization is fabulous," one homeowner wrote in response to a survey the Neighborhood Trees program conducted. "The care that goes into planning these events shows. It was a pleasure to be a part of it."

## *Natural Area Restoration*

With the help of more than 1,100 dedicated volunteers, the Natural Area Restoration program planted and maintained 20,132 native trees, shrubs and perennials at 22 planting events and 13 maintenance events during fiscal year 2008. Our volunteers came from four counties and seven cities to help with the restoration efforts.

The Natural Area Restoration program added nine new projects sites during the 2008 season—three in Portland, two in Gresham, two in Tualatin, one in Sherwood, and one in Happy Valley. The program also added the World Forestry Center and the city of Happy Valley as project partners.

Friends of Trees' Natural Area Restoration program continues to grow and change. In the summer of 2008 we added a new Natural Area Restoration specialist, Betsy Lattig, who has endless enthusiasm for the organization and for the volunteers who make it successful.

## *Our Volunteers*

During the 2008 fiscal year, nearly 2,000 volunteers contributed more than 18,000 hours to Friends of Trees. Since our inception in 1989, Friends of Trees' volunteers have made a lasting impact through direct action—actually increasing tree cover in the Portland-metro area while dozens of US cities watched their tree cover shrink.

Homeowners buy and plant trees in their parking strips and yards at community plantings, and volunteers plant native trees and plants on Saturday mornings to

restore local watersheds. The impact of each individual's actions is immediately apparent—and it grows over time.

Crew leaders and neighborhood coordinators form the core of our volunteer program.

"I love being a crew leader with Friends of Trees," said Tricia Sears. "I started out volunteering at natural area plantings in January 1995 and trained to be a crew leader for both Natural Area Restoration and Neighborhood Trees that November. ... I love it. You get to be out on a Saturday morning, in warm or cold weather, in sunshine, rain, or snow. Yes snow!

"Crew leaders tend to laugh and joke a lot. Of course, we seek out the warm drinks that Friends of Trees provides on cold mornings, while we listen attentively to the instructions for the day and get ready for the crowds.

"Going back each year to see the plants grow and the natural areas change is very exciting and rewarding. I recently described to someone that I am a tree planter-a-holic!

"I met my boyfriend at the February 2008 planting in Gresham. Maybe people who dig soil and plant together, grow together. If you can be covered in mud and encased in warm clothes and rain gear, and find someone in that condition, anything is possible. FOT rocks!"

## *Gift Trees*

Cher Greenleaf, her sisters, and five carloads of friends joined the planters gathered at Friends of Trees' annual gift tree planting at the Tualatin River National Wildlife Refuge on March 16, 2008. Their mother Helen had passed away several months before.

"She was the mother who brought neighbors together," Cher said, explaining that her mother rallied her neighbors together for projects, including one to save the neighborhood's elms. To celebrate her life and dedication to trees, Helen's neighbors bought five gift groves in her memory. "It's almost like a second memorial for my Mom," Cher said, gazing out over the young native trees that the group planted.

The Greenleafs were only a few of the 200 people who planted on March 16. Others planted trees in honor of weddings, births, birthdays, bar and bat mitzvahs, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, graduation, and the December holidays.

Gift trees give people an opportunity to celebrate life events, remember loved ones, and heal the earth. Friends of Trees' Gift Trees program provided \$31,000 for our Natural Area Restoration planting program during the 2008 fiscal year. ## *Friends of Trees Leaders*

On May 21, Friends of Trees presented our first annual Individual, Community Partner, and Business Leadership awards.

Charlie Swindells received the Individual Leadership Award for his commitment and dedication to Friends of Trees for more than a decade. He joined Friends of Trees' board of directors in 1999 and served as board president for six of those years. In his unassuming, behind-the-scenes manner, Charlie helped Friends of Trees grow into one of the most respected environmental and civic organizations in our state. His steadfast leadership and guidance represents a quality that often goes unrecognized: giving of oneself without expectation of recognition in return. Charlie has always done this with energy, passion and optimism.

Portland Environmental Services Director Dean Marriott accepted Friends of Trees' Community Partner Leadership Award on behalf of Portland's Bureau of Environmental Services. BES has been a significant partner of Friends of Trees for more than a decade, providing major support for nearly every kind of work we do—from outreach to street tree plantings to natural area restoration projects throughout the city. These projects include street tree plantings in the Columbia Slough Watershed and restoration of natural areas impacted by the Westside Big Pipe

Project. During Friends of Trees' 2008 fiscal year, BES committed \$218,000 in Community Benefit Opportunity funds to increase tree cover in low-canopy eastside neighborhoods over the next two years.

Friends of Trees presented then-PGE CEO and President Peggy Fowler with the first annual Business Leadership Award in recognition of the company's significant financial and volunteer support for more than a dozen years. PGE was a major funder of Friends of Trees' Seed the Future campaign from 1996-2001, which resulted in the planting of more than 157,000 trees and native plants in the Portland-Vancouver area. In addition to continued funding since Seed the Future, PGE has consistently inspired its employees to volunteer at Friends of Trees plantings, greatly enhancing our ability to increase our region's tree cover.

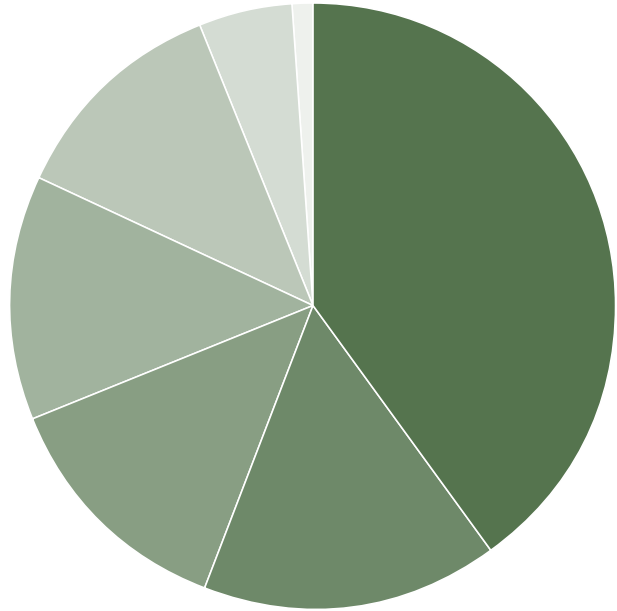

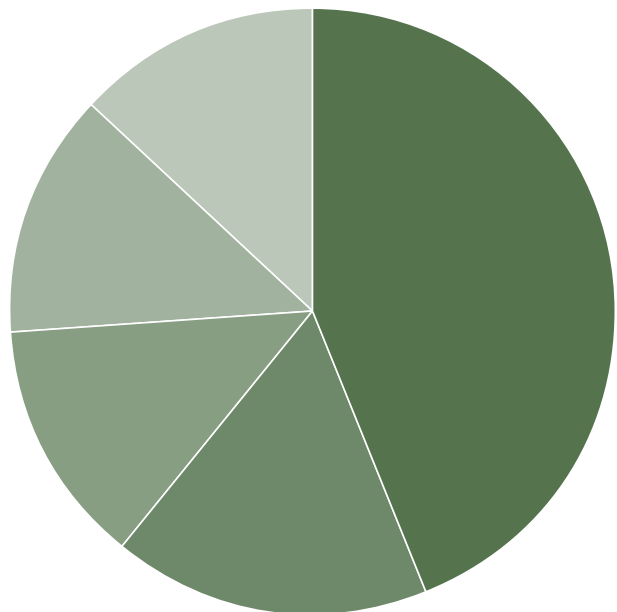

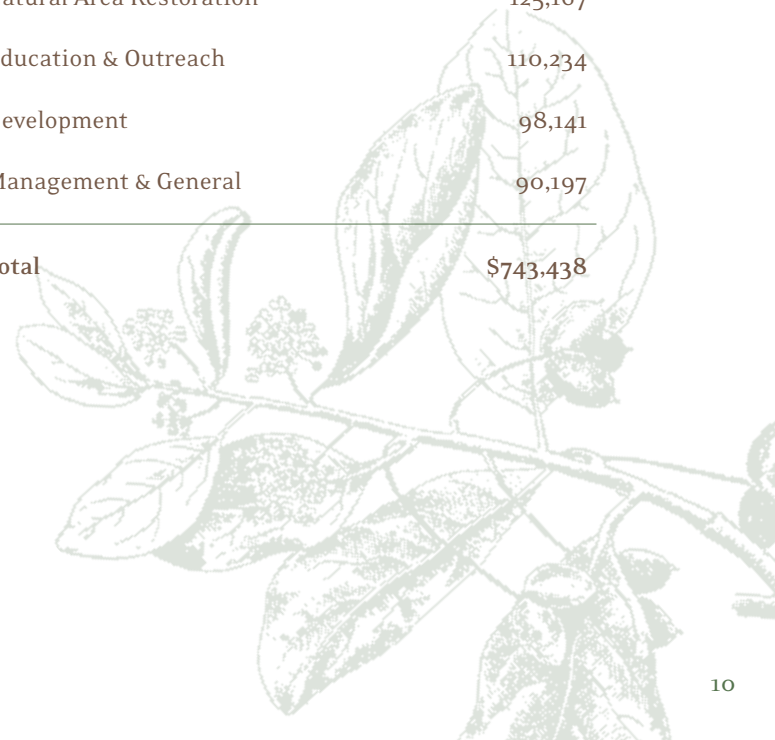
